








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Can you believe we have been in school for almost a quarter of the school year? The students are settled in and are learning, playing, and praying!

An annual tradition at SMCS, the second and third grade students honor All Saints Day with a Procession of Saints through the church after Mass on November 1 featuring each student dressed as a saint. The museum highlights the religious foundations of our education at SMCS as well as demonstrating the application of the writing process.

Technology in Education: How SMCS Is Embracing the Future

St. Mary has introduced a new technology curriculum this year for all grades. It aims to make students proficient in the use of Microsoft Office tools, knowledgeable about the hardware that comprises a computer, and informed about basic coding principles.

"The objective of the new curriculum is to prepare students to be well rounded leaders who make a difference in the world around them using their knowledge and faith," says Mrs. Halbardier. "Technology is constantly changing, and the program will expand and update as needed."

The first priority for the year across all levels was internet safety and personal safety online. Keyboard familiarity and skills were then highlighted. From there, topics vary by grade.

PreK students work on use of a mouse and opening apps to play educational

games. Kindergartners additionally use Paint and learn to save files.

Throughout the elementary grades, students become proficient in the use of Word, PowerPoint, and Excel through various projects.



"More than 80% of corporate America uses Microsoft's Cloud Suite, and that number is rising," says Mrs. Pate. We need to prepare our students for success by giving them an excellent education in these necessary tools."

Elementary aged students also learn more about internet searching strategies, reliable sources, and social media including how their actions online impact themselves and others. As time permits, they will even gain exposure to coding principles using a program called <u>Blockly</u> and use tablets to record and edit video.

At the junior high level, students will be using all their MS Office skills on big projects. They will also learn about the computer hardware and the various technical specs. This will help them to fix their own issues and know how to evaluate

> different options when purchasing. The technology curriculum also incorporates the <u>Virtues in Practice</u> series developed by the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia as an integration of traditional Catholic values and modern technology.

Registration has started for the upcoming basketball season! Some important information:


- Basketball is currently open to boys and girls in grades 5-8.
