Welcome back to SMCS! I am so glad to see that our students are back in the


classrooms with their

COVID-19 LEADS TO BIG CHANGES AT ST. MARY CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Beginning in March 2020, COVID-19 disrupted the lives and normal routines of everyone in our community and world at large. Distance learning last year was successful through the cooperative work between SMCS Faculty and Staff and all of our parents, students, and extended family members. For the 2020-21 school year, SMCS Administration, Faculty, and Staff are working continuously to modify existing practices and develop new routines to safeguard the health and safety of everyone in the SMCS family. Every SMCS family has a part in making the year successful!

symptoms first appeared

Parents must enter the school, wearing a mask, to sign students out for appointments or early pick ups. Early pick up should be no later than 2:45 PM

Upon return to school, a staff member from the office will bring students back into the building. Parent sign-in is not required.

Visitors and Volunteers

No visitors or volunteers are allowed in the school at this time.

Car Lines

Mornings: Students should be masked and ready to have temperatures checked prior to drop off.

Afternoons: All students are being released in

one car line at the front of the school. Follow directions from Mrs. Neschich and form multiple lines to keep cars from blocking traffic in the street.

Afternoon Car Line is complete by 3:35. Any students remaining will go to After Care.

Virtual Teacher Conferences

Friday, September 25th

This month, parent/teacher conferences will be held via Teams. For general information on Teams see Page 6. To access the conferences, you will need to use your child(ren)'s Office 365 login information. This was sent to you earlier this month by Mrs. Pate in an e-mail with the subject "Confidential". The meeting invitation will be sent to each student's @stmarylc.org e-mail address, not to the parents' e-mail addresses!

To find it, follow the steps below. For more detailed directions refer to this document or the how-to video.

- Go to http://stmarylc.org/library. In the top grid, click on the block that is in the second row, second column (called "Office").
- 2. Sign in to Office 365 using your child's login ID, then select "Outlook" from the row of icons.
- 3. Conference e-mail invitations will be in your child(ren)'s Inbox and will include information on the conference time and a link to "Join Microsoft Teams Meeting". At the stated time, click that link.
- 4. You will be prompted to choose whether to use the browser or to download the desktop app for the meetings. The how-to-document provides more details on these and other in-meeting options.

Separate parents will be able to access Teams simultaneously from different locations, both using your child's login ID.

FAQ About Microsoft Teams

Q: What is Teams?

A: Teams is an online meeting platform that is included in the Microsoft Office 365 school subscription and integrates with other Office 365 applications. With Teams, students and teachers will also be able to instantly share files, check for understanding with instant-feedback surveys/quizzes and share an online notebook where they can save

their ideas. Perhaps the most attractive feature of Teams is that it provides a type of "intra-net" meeting place. Only those with access within the St. Mary Catholic School Office 365 system will be allowed to enter meetings, making students and meetings safe and secure.



Q: How and why would I use Teams?

A: Parent/teacher conferences will be held via Teams on Friday, September 25. Refer to the how-to.com/how-t

Q: How much will students use Teams?

A: While in a face-to-face learning mode, Junior High students will use this and other Office 365 applications. Other grades will be able use applications such as Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and OneNote, but not Teams or Outlook (the email

component of Office 365). If SMCS moves to a hybrid or distance-learning mode, students can expect to use Teams every day. Each class a student would normally attend in a face-to-face setting will be held instead via Teams. Same time. Same teacher. Same class. It's just a different mode.

Q: How will this work with the Learning Management System (LMS) offered in RenWeb/ FACTS?

A: Teams and the LMS complement each other in the hybrid and distance-learning environments. Teams offers live, face-to-face teaching and parent meetings. Families and staff will all use Teams. The LMS is used only by teachers and students,

providing a place for them to conduct class business that may not be "real-time." It also allows teachers to post assignments that connect directly with classroom gradebooks, store important class documents, and receive uploads of student homework. Recording live sessions in Teams facilitates teacher connections with students who are absent during the live class. The recording is made and uploaded to the SMCS Office 365 One Drive, after which the teacher posts a link to those sessions with associated make-up work documents, in the LMS.
